"Discovery and Experimentation in the Natural World": St. James School

2021 Recipients of the Michael Carty Award

The community of St. James School in Lively, Ontario is extremely grateful to have received the opportunity to enhance our outdoor and experiential learning initiatives through the lens of Catholic Education as a recipient of the Michael Carty Award in 2021. Our project objectives were to highlight the importance of caring for God's creation, a major tenet of Catholic Social Teachings, while fostering active environmental stewardship and deepening our appreciation for the beauty of our natural surroundings that have been entrusted to us to care for.

We started off the project by creating "Discovery Kits" that could be used to spark a variety of different inquiries aimed at strengthening our connections with nature, while promoting collaboration, critical-thinking, respect and sustainability practices. Once these bins were inventoried and itemized, we immediately saw a need for a common space to store these materials, as to ensure that they could be readily accessible and organized for as many classes as possible.

Although we considered having a pergola added to our outdoor classroom, we ultimately decided to use the award funds to build a storage shed to house the "Discovery Kits", along with our snowshoes and winter accessories. We felt that it would allow educators to access the resources with independence and greater ease.

Some of the activities that the students have engaged in throughout this endeavour include: water sampling and conservation lessons (tied into the Church teachings of "Water as Sacred and Essential to Life"), exploring animal adaptations for winter through the creation of habitat diaoramas (with a faith connection to the story of creation and the Family Life strand of "Living in Solidarity"). Other collaborative projects involved planting sunflowers for Catholic Education Week ("Rebuild, Restore, Renew") and using butterfly hatching kits to draw parallels to the story of Jesus and his rebirth.

Our students and educators have really enjoyed these new opportunities to "take the learning outside". It is important to us as a school community that we provide our students with a sound understanding of learning in nature and learning with nature as they become Christians who care for and respect our environment. The next phase of this project will be started this spring, as we hope to add community gardens to our school yard to help restore native plant habitats in the school yard and preserve local biodiversity.
